1. The Personal Argument: vs 1- 5

Key verse: (3:4) *Have ye suffered so many things in vain? if it be yet in vain.*

a. They Saw God the Son Crucified: (3:1)

1st, he is not calling them Faithless/lost as (Matt 5:22)

b. They Received the Holy Spirit: (3:2-3) (Rom 8:9)

1.) How the Holy Spirit Works in Salvation:

a.) He Convicts the Lost Sinner: (Jn 16:7-11)

i.) The Sinner can resist the Spirit: (Acts 7:51)

ii.) The Sinner can Yield to the Spirit.

b.) He Births the believer/gives new life: (Jn 3:1-8)

c.) He Baptizes into Family of God: (1Cor12:12-14)

d.) He Seals the believer: (Eph 1:13-14)

2.) The Believer has a responsibility to the Spirit:

(1 Cor 6:19-20)

a.) The Believer should not grieve the Holy Spirit:

(Eph 4:30)

b.) The Believer should turn at conviction in order not to Quench the Holy Spirit: (1 Thes 5:19)

i.) The Spirit never leaves a Believer: (Jn 14:16)

c.) The Believer should be Filled with the Spirit:

(Eph 5:18-21) (Foundational 5)

This is a continuous experience: (Jn 7:37-39)

d.) The Believer should Walk in the Spirit:

(Gal 5:16, 25)

This is a Submission/Yielding to all of ourselves to the Holy Spirit's Control moment by moment throughout our day: (Rom 6:12-16)
