## **Definition:** To be pronounced righteous.

The Legal and Judicial Act where God declares the believer righteous in Jesus Christ.

# The two aspects of justification:

The forgiveness, remission, & removal of the believer's sin
The imputation of the Righteousness of Christ.

## B. Justification defended:

In Chapter 3 & 4, God inspires Paul to use 6 different Arguments to prove that God save sinners through faith in Christ and not by the works of the law.

As a Lawyer, Paul crafts his Argument in Defense of Salvation of Grace through Faith w/o the world of the Law. <u>A Personal Argument</u>: (3:1-5) Paul challenged them to Recall their own personal salvation

experience.

<u>A Scriptural Argument</u>: (3:6-14) Quoting 6 OT passages to prove his point.

<u>A Logical Argument</u>: (3:15-29) Reasoning on what a Covenant is & how it works.

<u>A Historical Argument</u>: (4:1-11)

Explaining the place of the Law in the history of Israel.

- B. He laments their Regression into Bonfage: (4:8-11)

#### I. <u>A Sentimental Argument</u>: (4:12-18) Asking them to remember his love/relationship w/him.
