Not Just the removal of the believers guilt, but the imputation of Christ's Righteousness in it's place.

The Law Did Not Add to the Abrahamic Covenant of Faith (Ro 4:9-10; 13-14)

It certainly did not Cancel it. (Ro 3:19-20) (Ga 3:19, 22, 24)

Legalism: Adding to the Word of God

Liberalism: Taking Away from the Word of God

It is God's Will that Everyone be given the gospel: (Mk 16:15)

It is God's literal will that everyone be saved: (2 Pet 3:9).

It is God's Literal Will that every Saved person be baptized, identifying themself with the Christ's Gospel, Christ's Doctrines. (Matt 28:20)(Acts 19:1-6)

It is God's Literal Will that every saved, baptized person join a local church: (Acts 2:41)(Acts 9:26)

PURPOSE OF THE LAW TO POINT TO CHRIST (Ga 3:19-25)

- (1) "Because of transgression," (vs 19)
- (2) to "conclude all under sin," (Vs 22)
- (3) to last "till the seed should come"
- (4) to "shut man up" to faith as avenue of escape from sin (v 23)
- (5) "as a Schoolmaster" teacher, instructor, & guide (Vs 24)
- (6) Since Christ came none is under the law pedagogue longer. (Vs 25) (Ro 4:15) (Ro 7:7,13)
- (1) in the annunciation of His begettal: (Mt 1:20-21)
- (2) in the annunciation of His birth: (Lu 2:9-14)
- (3) In the annunciation of His resurrection: (Mt 28:27)
- (4) In the annunciation of His return to earth, when He shall return as "King of kings and Lord of lords": (Acts 1:10-11)

Jesus Christ mediates between God who is holy and man who is unholy to bring them in harmony, (1Ti 2:4-6) (1Co 8:6)

Christ Takes us in hand Past the Penalty & Power of the Law of death, into the very presence of God the Father.

The fact is that no such law exists: (Ga 2:16, 21)

Life was forfeited by sin, but restored by the righteousness of Christ imputed to believers, (2 Co 5:21)

When life is offered by law keeping it is the extension of physical life. (Eze 20:10-11)(Isa 45:22)hment.
