<u>Text</u>: (Joel 3:14)

Purpose:

To warn Judah of God's impending judgment because of their sins and to urge them to turn back to God

Author: Joel, Name Means: "The Lord is God"

<u>To Whom Written</u>: The Southern Kingdom.

Date Written: 835 B.C.

Reign of King Joash - 7years old. Mentored by High Priest Jehoiada

Setting:

The people of Judah had become prosperous and complacent. Taking God for granted, self-centeredness, idolatry, and sin. Joel warns them about God's judgment.

<u>A national calamity</u>: a ferocious Plague of Locust. Peter will use Joel as his text for his Pentecost Sermon.

A Day of Reckoning is Coming. (Rev 20:12)

CHURCH: (1 Thes 5:1-11)

Notice a number of pertinent points.

- 1. Comes suddenly, without any warning, vs. 1.
- 2. A time of destruction, vs. 2.
- 3. The church are not here: vs. 4-5.
- 4. God has not appointed the church to wrath: vs. 9.
- 5. Being spared brings us comfort, vs. 10.

God's Son will open the scroll judgments: (Rev 5:1-9) (John 5:22, 27)

The seal judgments: (Revelation 6: 1,3,5,7,9,12-17). These judgments are the wrath of God (Rev 6:16-17)

FINAL THOUGHTS

The wrath of God, for the Unbeliever, is the coming Your destiny can be that of blessing instead. How does one change his or her destiny?

Simply by believing the gospel, (1 Cor 15:1-4), Ask the Lord to save you (Rom 10:9-13).
