TUESDAY EVENINGS

8:00 PM Baptists in America (H&S306)

S. Moore

In 400 years, Baptists have grown from a persecuted minority to the second-largest religious group in America. But those carrying the Baptist name today represent a wide diversity of beliefs and practices. This course will examine the people, events, and controversies that shaped Baptist groups in America from the beginning of the 19th century to today, enabling students to better understand the diversity of Baptist teachings they may encounter.

9:00 PM Pastoral Care II (PAS422)

This course gives scriptural guidance and practical tools for the work of pastoral counseling and care-giving by a church pastor. (Second of two semesters)

THURSDAY EVENINGS

7:00 PM Bible Doctrine II (BIB102)

A systematic study of the basic teachings of the Bible. Special attention is paid to the doctrines that differentiate the Baptists from other groups. This study is designed to provide a foundation for the student in understanding and articulating our core beliefs. (Second of two semesters)

8:00 PM Bible Background (INT202) J. Bowling

The course aims to improve the student's understanding of scripture, focusing on the elements of Bible background. In this context, Bible background means information about Old and New Testament Biblical doctrines and practices, culture, customs, daily activities, archaic terminology, metrics (time, distance, mass and volume), places, events, and key characters that are not familiar to the modern lay person. This course will use research, discovery, and practical application activities to introduce students to many of the elements used to establish the proper background for passages of scripture. This course will also help the student develop the study resources and skills to answer Bible background related questions in the future.

All courses will be taught using a virtual format this semester.
